### Rebuilding lives through jobs.

The Mile High WorkShop is an employment and job training program for those facing barriers to work through the manufacturing and production of handmade goods.

The WorkShop provides manufacturing services in sewing, woodworking, laser etching/cutting, and handmade assembly, in order to employ men and women rebuilding from homelessness, addictions, and incarceration.

We offer soft skills training through help of our social work intern along with technical skills development.




